## Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE)

You can access JAE-IS with your SingPass or JAE PIN (in Form A\*).

School candidates will receive a digital copy of Form A via your registered email addresses from 3pm on Friday, 10 January 2025.

\*Form A will list the applicant's gross aggregate scores for JC, MI, polytechnic, ITE aggregate types and courses which he/she is eligible to apply for under the JAE.



#### Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE)

Through this exercise, eligible GCE O-Level certificate holders can apply online for admissions into junior colleges (JCs), Millennia Institute (MI), polytechnics, and Institute of Technical Education (ITE). Learn about the process, how to prepare and apply.

### **Advice for JAE Application**

- 1. Consider all 12 course choices wisely before submitting online.
- 2. Refer to the important points to note for registration of courses before making your course choices.
- 3. Beyond academic requirements, some courses may require you to meet non-academic requirements, such as passing of pre-admission medical examination before enrolment. These requirements can be found in the JAE information booklet, and you are advised to consider these requirements when making your choices.
- 4. The L1R5 net aggregate and ELR2B2 net aggregates of the lowest ranked students who were admitted to the JC and polytechnic courses respectively through the 2024 JAE serve only as a guide and do not constitute the admission scores for the 2025 JAE admission exercises.

## **Advice for JAE Application**

- 5. You should indicate at least 2 to 3 courses where your aggregate scores (net) are much better than the course cut-off points (COP) in 2024 JAE, to stand a better chance for admission.
- 6. You should not make only a few course choices. In the event you are unsuccessful in getting a place in any of your registered choices, you will be posted to a course with remaining vacancies after all the other students are being posted according to their registered choices.



### Students eligible for JC / MI Admission

- You must satisfy the admission criteria to JC and/ or MI.
   The Aggregate Type for JC Course is L1R5 and MI Course is L1R4.
- The aggregate score computation for L1R5 and L1R4 is based on the aggregate computation table.

Students who have **met the entry requirements** for admission to JC/MI will be **eligible to register** for JC/MI courses during the JAE registration period.



#### Students eligible for Poly Admission

You need to **meet** the **two requirements**:

- 1. The entry requirements for admission to Polytechnic (obtain 26 points or better for the net *ELR2B2* aggregate score)
- 2. The Minimum Entry Requirement (MER) for the Polytechnic course (i.e. minimum subject grades).



#### Students eligible for <a href="ITE Admission">ITE Admission</a>

- You can apply for Higher Nitec courses/Nitec courses under the January 2025 Joint Intake Exercise 'O' (JIEO).
- You can also apply for the *Higher Nitec* courses under the April 2025 Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE).
- ITE will provide a personalised Form J.



**Form J** shows the list of full-time ITE courses that a graduate is eligible to apply for based on his/her GCE 'O' Level examination results.



### Students eligible for <a href="ITE Admission">ITE Admission</a>

- To apply for admission to Higher Nitec (2 years) course, you need to meet the two requirements:
  - 1. Sit for the GCE O-Level subjects shown in the ELB4, ELR1B3 & ELR2B2 ITE Courses Table
  - 2. Minimum entry requirements (MER) for the *Higher Nitec* course (i.e. minimum subject grades).

Details of the courses' MER can be found in the JIE 'O' Level Admission Booklet.

## Students who have accepted offers through 2024 Direct School Admission (DSA) – JCs

- 1. You will be admitted to your chosen JC if you have **met the eligibility criteria for admission based on your GCE O-Level examination results**.

  You do not need to participate in the JAE.
- 2. Successful DSA-JC students will receive their Form A that indicate the school they are posted to. Report to the posted school on Wednesday 5 February 2025.

Students who did not meet the JC admission criteria will need to take part in the JAE to apply for other courses which they are eligible for.



## Students who had accepted conditional offers through 2024 Early Admissions Exercise (EAE) – Polytechnics

- 1. Your offer would have been confirmed once you met the following criteria.
  - (a) A net ELR2B2 score of 26 points or lower for the GCE O-Level examinations; and
  - (b) Minimum Entry Requirements for the respective polytechnic courses.

You do not need to participate in the JAE.

2. Successful Poly EAE students will receive their Form A that indicate the institution they are posted to. Refer to the email/mailed package for enrolment details by end-February.

Students who did not meet the above criteria will need to apply via the JAE for Poly courses which they are eligible for.



## Students who had accepted conditional offers through 2024 Early Admissions Exercise (EAE) – ITE

1. Your offer would have been confirmed once you met the subject-specific Minimum Entry Requirements for the course based on your GCE O-Level results.

You will not need to participate in the JAE.

- 2. Successful ITE EAE students will be informed by ITE.
- 3. Refer to your email for ITE enrolment details which will be sent on 4 February 2025.

## **JAE Posting**

The JAE application ends on Wednesday, 15 January 2025 (4pm).

- 1. JAE Posting will commence, and students will be posted to a course based on merit according to their net aggregate scores.
- 2. A student with a **better net aggregate score** will be **considered for admission first**, subject to the availability of vacancies in the selected course.
- 3. If there are **no vacancies**, then the student **will be considered** for his/her **next choice course**.



#### **Appeal and Transfer**

- The JAE posting results will be released on Tuesday, 4 February 2025.
- 1. Applicants who wish to appeal for a JC or MI courses should contact the institution(s) directly, though they would likely be unsuccessful if they have not met the course cut-off point and do not present extenuating circumstances to merit a transfer. Eligible appeals will be given due consideration, subject to available vacancies and school's admission criteria.
- 2. Students who wish to appeal for a place in a Polytechnic or ITE Higher Nitec course may do so online at <a href="https://jaeappeal.edu.sg">https://jaeappeal.edu.sg</a> from Tuesday, 4 February 2025 (9am) to Friday, 7 February 2025 (4pm). Release of results will be on Friday, 21 February 2025 (9am).

## **Appeal**

- Students not posted to any course during the JAE are encouraged to submit an appeal and view the results of the appeal through the portal.
- 1. At the end of the combined appeals period, students who had not received any Polytechnic or ITE Higher Nitec posting to a course of their choice during the JAE Posting or JAE Appeals will be offered a place in an alternative Polytechnic or ITE course.
- 2. Offers will be given based on **students meeting the minimum entry requirements and aggregate score of the lowest ranked students** who were admitted to these courses.
- 3. The intent of this offer is to **provide students an additional option** for post-secondary education.

Students who wish to appeal for a transfer to another course or institution should approach the institution directly.


#### **Students Posted to JC/MI**

- 1. Report to your posted JC or MI on Wednesday, 5 February 2025.
- 2. You may wear your secondary school uniform and bring your original identification documents (NRIC, student pass or passport) when you report.
- 3. If you are unable to report to your posted JC or MI on the first day of school due to valid reasons, you should contact your posted school directly to confirm that you are taking up the place, and the school will reserve the place for you.
- 4. If you are waiting for an appeal outcome, you should still report to the posted school. You should inform your posted JC or MI if your appeal is successful.



#### Students Posted to Polytechnic / ITE

- 1. Applicants **posted to ITE** will receive an email with the enrolment details on **Tuesday, 4 February 2025**.
- 2. Applicants **posted to polytechnics** will receive an email or package via mail on enrolment details **by end-February 2025**. Check your email regularly as some courses would require applicants to go for medical check-up.
- 3. If you are waiting for an appeal outcome, you should still accept the posted course offer online. You should inform your posted institution if your appeal is successful, and you have accepted an offer in another institution.



## Progression Pathways for Secondary Four Normal (Academic) Students

For Secondary 4 Normal (Academic) [N(A)] students who have sat for GCE O-Level subjects in 2024.

You can use your GCE O-Level results for these subjects to apply for a place in the Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP) and Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP).



#### Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP) – an alternative to Secondary 5 N(A)

- 1 year foundation programme with a practice-oriented approach to prepare students for entry into the relevant diploma courses in the Polytechnic.
- Students are eligible to apply for the PFP if they obtain a raw ELMAB3 aggregate of 12 points or lower and meet the subject-specific requirements for their chosen course.

PFP-eligible students will receive a copy of **Form P** during the collection of results. **Form P contains a unique password**. Interested students should use their respective passwords to **submit their applications online** via the **PFP website** at <a href="https://pfp.polytechnic.edu.sg/PFP/index.html">https://pfp.polytechnic.edu.sg/PFP/index.html</a>.

More information on the eligibility requirements for the PFP, as well as how O-Level results are considered in the computation of the ELMAB3 aggregate, can be found on the PFP website.

- Apply for PFP: Friday, 10 January 2025 (1.30pm) to Wednesday, 15 January 2025 (4pm).
- Release of PFP posting results (through PFP website): Wednesday, 22 January 2025 (1.30pm)
- Accept, reject, or appeal for a change of course: By Monday, 27 January 2025 (4pm)



#### **Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP)**

The DPP prepares students for progression into selected polytechnic diploma courses via a two-year Higher Nitec course at ITE. Students are eligible to apply if they obtain a raw ELMAB3 aggregate of 19 points or lower and meet the subject-specific requirements for their chosen course.

Eligible Secondary 4 N(A) students may submit their DPP applications and view the posting results online via the DPP application portal at <a href="http://www.ite.edu.sg/apply-for-ite-courses">http://www.ite.edu.sg/apply-for-ite-courses</a>.

- Applications for the DPP: Friday, 10 January 2025 (12am) to Tuesday, 14 January 2025 (11.59pm)
- Release of Posting results (final application phase): Wednesday, 17 January 2025 (9am)
- Accept or reject the DPP offer: By Tuesday, 21 February 2025 (11.59pm)



#### For successful PFP and/or DPP applicants

Students who have been **offered a place in the DPP** (final application phase) should **report to ITE** on **Wednesday, 22 January 2025** upon acceptance of their DPP course offer.

The last day of school for Secondary 5 students who have accepted a place in the PFP will be on Friday, 31 January 2025.

Students will be informed by the respective polytechnics on the enrolment dates for the PFP.

Students who have accepted a place in the earlier application phase of the DPP in December but decided to take up a PFP offer now must withdraw from the DPP first before they are able to take up the PFP offer.

DPP-enrolled students should check with their ITE class advisor for more details on the DPP withdrawal process and deadlines for withdrawal.


Actions to take for <u>any amendment</u> to the <u>CCA Certificate</u> or <u>Testimonial</u> <u>Draft</u>

- STILL <u>acknowledge the RECEIPT</u>
- Clearly <u>indicate the error</u> and bring the <u>edited copy</u> to the <u>General</u>
   Office after release of results (4 pm onwards)
- Ask for a <u>duplicate copy</u> to facilitate your applications <u>before you leave</u> the General Office



### **Certificate Amendment Request**

- Candidates may request for a re-print of their current exam year certificate only if their name has been printed wrongly due to misspelling.
- There is an administrative fee of S\$50.00 (inclusive of GST) for the amendment of each GCE O-Level certificate.
- Request must be submitted to the school by <u>16 January 2025</u>. Each request will be reviewed and is subjected to approval.



#### **Appeal for Review of Results**

- Candidates can request for an appeal to review their results. This comprises a review of the marking and a full clerical re-check. The candidate will be informed of the outcome via a letter. No report on the candidate's performance will be provided.
- The deadline for the application for appeal of results and the payment of appeal fees is **16 January 2025**.
- Please note that no further application will be considered after the appeal deadline.
- All appeals must be <u>submitted through the school</u>.
- A fee will be charged for an appeal to review the result for each subject.
   E.g. Individual Appeal
  - The fee is <u>S\$114.45 per subject</u> (inclusive of GST).
  - The outcome of the Appeal is expected to be released to schools by 24 February 2025.

## **Applications Procedure for Repeat students**

• Eligible students who wish to repeat Sec 4E or Sec 5N(A) should complete <u>the</u> <u>application form from the General Office</u> and submit it to the school in either of the time periods shown below:

#### (a) First period

 By the 5th working day from the date of release of the GCE O-Level Examination results. The first working day is taken to be the day after the release of the GCE O-Level Examination results; or

#### (b) Second period

• By the 5th working day, from the date of release of the Joint Admissions Exercise (JAE) posting results. **The first working day** is taken to be the **day after the release** of the JAE posting results.
