2. School Structures and Programmes

2.1 <u>Blended Learning (BL) for Sec1, 2 and 3 Students only</u>

- Term 3 HBL Days on even week Wednesdays are as follows:
- For Secondary 1, 2 and 3 Students: 6 July, 20 July, 3 August, 17 August and 31 August 2022.
- On HBL Days, Secondary 1 to 3 students will follow the school's timetable for Wednesday, from 7.30 am to 1.30 pm, including the Recess period which will serve as a break for the students. To engage students in different modes of learning, teachers will leverage on digital platforms e.g. SLS, Google Classroom. - Secondary 4/5 students will attend school.

2.2 Night Study for Graduating Classes

To help our graduating students to prepare for the coming prelim and national examinations, the school will be opening its facilities for our students to do self-revision from **5 July to 5 August.** Your child/ward will be identified to attend the Night Study sessions based on her performance in his/her Mid-Year Examinations. 4. Pupil Management Matters

4.1 <u>Punctuality</u>

The school constantly seeks to inculcate sound values in our students and being punctual for school is one such value. Students who are late for school for two or more occasions are required to serve detention after school on the same day, during which, they will engage in self-study or reading. All students required to serve detention must do so on the actual offence date regardless of involvement in competitions, tuition classes, remedial sessions and CCAs. Recalcitrant offenders who do not respond positively to the school's intervention measures may face other disciplinary actions such as in-school/home suspension or caning.

4.2 School Dismissal

All students will be dismissed at 2.40pm on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays. On Wednesdays, students will be dismissed at 1.30pm and on Fridays at 12.30pm.

4.3 MOE Safe Management Measures (SMM)

In line with the easing of community SMMs, SMMs for schools are guided by the broad parameters presented below:

(A) Mask Wearing

Students are required to remain mask-on in indoor settings e.g. classroom, school canteen but will remain optional in outdoor settings.

(B) Being Socially Responsible

While MOH has stopped issuing health risk notices (HRN) to close contacts of Covid-19 positive cases. Parents are to alert the Character Coaches if their child in HS has tested positive for Covid-19.

(C) Wipe-Down Routine

Students will continue their personal hygiene habits and wipe-down routine of tables and shared equipment after use.

(D) <u>Semesterly Attendance and Temperature-Taking Exercise (ATTEx)</u>

The objectives of ATTEx are:

- a. **To maintain schools' preparedness** to re-activate the attendance and temperature-taking regime should there be a need to, and
- b. **To educate students to take personal responsibility** for their own health and practise social responsibility.

ATTEx will be reduced to once a term. For Term 3, we will be conducting temperature-taking on **Wednesday**, **29 June**.

All the above safe management measures will continue until otherwise advised, pending the national posture in response to the COVID-19 situation. For updates on the COVID-19 situation, you can visit moh.gov.sg or sign up at go.gov.sg/whatsapp to receive the latest information via WhatsApp.

4.4 Mobile Phone and Electronic Devices

In order for effective teaching and learning to take place, we need to set boundaries for our students. Mobile phones/electronic devices may be used only during these timings:

- Before 7.30 am
- During recess time (restricted to the canteen and the foyer area only)
- After the last period of the formal curriculum time

We would like to emphasize that our students are to switch off their mobile phones and any other electronic devices during curriculum time. The mobile phones are to be kept in the bags. Mobile phones/electronic devices should also be kept out of sight and switched off/kept on silent mode during the change-over of lessons and while students are walking along the corridor.

If the mobile phone policy is violated, the mobile phone/electronic device will be confiscated and kept under lock and key in the General Office. Confiscated handphones/electronic devices will be returned only after 5 school days.

4.5 Maintaining good behaviour at all times especially when in school uniform

The school places great emphasis on inculcating in our students good habits like using time prudently. As such, we would like to emphasize that students are not to loiter and misbehave in the neighbourhood after school. We urge you to strongly advise your child to behave appropriately at all times especially while he/she is in school uniform.

4.6 Attire and Grooming

The school's grooming and attire policy is one that is aimed at educating Hougeans to look smart, decent and presentable at all times. Having proper attire and grooming is an outward expression of the students being ready to learn. It is also important to the school as it signifies the pride that students have for themselves and the school. To up keep the above intent, grooming and attire check are carried out periodically throughout the year.

If the students' grooming and attire is not appropriate, a grace period of 2 days will be given for rectification with a follow-up check. Students who fail the follow-up check will be sent home to have the grooming issue rectified and parents will be informed.

CCA T-shirt

Secondary 1 to 5 students will be allowed to wear their approved CCA T-shirts on Tuesdays with school pants/skorts if they have no PE lessons. Students who have PE on that day will continue to report to school in their PE attire and then change into their CCA T-shirts during snack break, recess or after 2.40pm. Students who do not wish to wear their CCA T-shirts are expected to be in school attire according to their respective class timetables.

Exceptions apply during school and national examinations:

- Students are to wear full School uniform/School Polo-Ts on days with internal and national examinations.
- For Secondary 4 and 5 students, they will resume wearing full School uniform/School Polo-Ts from 1 August 2022.

4.7 Snack Break

There will be a 10-minute snack break on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday between 9.00-9.10am to enhance students' well-being. Students may bring light and healthy snacks from home to consume in class during the break. Some examples of such snacks are sandwiches, muffins, fruits such as apples and bananas and energy bars. As a whole-school effort, the students will take ownership in ensuring good hygiene practices to keep their classrooms clean and conducive for learning.

5. Communication with Teachers

5.1 In line with the Ministry of Education's Five-Day Work Week, parents are encouraged to respect teachers' personal time and space. Teachers can be contacted during weekdays

between 7:30am and 6pm. They are not expected to respond to parents'/ students' queries during weekends or after 6pm on weekdays except for emergencies.

All teachers' email addresses are available on the school's website for parents' convenience. Parents can also contact the General Office (tel. 63851990) for further assistance.

6. Using Students' Images/Recordings for Publications

6.1 Notice to Parents/Guardians

HS will be using students' images and/or recordings for school publications. Should parents/guardians have any concerns, kindly inform the school through your child's/ward's Character Coaches (CCs).
