2. School Structures and Programmes

2.1 Principal-Meets-Parents (PMP) Sessions and CCA Open House

The Secondary 1 PMP Session and CCA Open House for Secondary 1s will be held on Saturday, 14 January 2023. Due to space constraint, we would only be inviting 1 parent of each Secondary 1 student to attend PMP and the CCA Open House with their child. Parents are encouraged to attend these sessions to know more about the school's programme and CCA programme and to guide their child in deciding his/her CCA choices.

PMP sessions for Secondary 2, 3, 4 and 5s will be held in school on Saturday, 4 February 2023. All parents are strongly encouraged to attend the session.

Information on the above sessions will be sent via Parents Gateway. Parents will be able to indicate their attendance by submitting their reply by the deadline.

2.2 (a) Blended Learning

Blended Learning (BL) is part of MOE's efforts to further develop our students' ability to be self-directed, passionate and lifelong learners. As part of BL, in HS, Home-Based Learning (HBL) days will be scheduled once a fortnight on even week Wednesdays starting from Term 1 Week 6 for Secondary 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 students to complement teaching and learning in school.

- For Secondary 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 students, Term 1 HBL Days on even week Wednesdays are as follows: 8 February and 22 February.
- On HBL Days, Secondary 1 to 5 students will follow the school's timetable for Wednesday, from 7.30 am to 1.30 pm, including the Recess period which will serve as a break for the students.
- To engage students in different modes of learning, teachers will leverage on digital platforms e.g., SLS, Google Classroom. You may refer to this link: https://hougangsec.moe.edu.sg/quick-links/hbl-sil for the schedule and subjectspecific instructions.

(b) Student-Initiated Learning (SIL) on HBL days

As part of Blended Learning, there will also be an emphasis on student-initiated learning, whereby dedicated time and space will provided to allow students to exercise agency, explore their interests and passions, and learn within and beyond the curriculum, as part of their student's development experience.

HBL Days will be less structured than a typical school day to provide students scope to exercise self-directed learning. It will comprise time for both curriculum coverage and student-initiated learning as shown on the next page.

All Secondary 1 to 5 students will start to plan their SIL with advice from their Character Coaches from Term 1 Week 2 onwards. A notification via Parents Gateway will be sent in Term 1 Week 5 for your consent of your child's/ward's SIL plan so that they can start to work on realising their SIL plan.

We seek your understanding and support to ensure that all expenses incurred from your child's/ward's choice of SIL activities will not be reimbursed by the school. Please ensure that they ask for your permission if they wish to sign up for any courses or workshops.

2.3 Start of CCA

CCA sessions will be held on every Tuesday and Friday, starting from 6 January 2023 for Secondary 2 to 5 students. Students will be briefed about the Sec 1 CCA selection and allocation during formation week, with more information to be shared via School Website in due course.

5. Administrative Matters

5.1 Update of Parents' Contact Information

The school needs to have parents' latest contact information to maintain close communication and for use during emergency.

Hence, students will be given the contact information that the school currently has. Parents are requested to verify if the information is correct and submit it (with information edited, if necessary) to your child's Character Coaches by **Wednesday**, **25 January 2023**.

5.2 <u>School Smart Cards (For Secondary 1 Students)</u>

Please note that all students entering Secondary 1 in January 2023 will be issued new Secondary level School Smart Cards (SSC). The cards will be issued to the students in due course.

While waiting for their Secondary level SSCs to be ready, students can continue to use their Primary level SSCs for concessionary travel till end April 2023. Students can still purchase the Bus Concession Pass (BCP) using their Primary level SSCs but they would need to purchase the BCP for Secondary School students.

6. Pupil Management Matters

6.1 Punctuality

The school constantly seeks to inculcate sound values in our students and being punctual for school is one such value. Students who are late for school for two or more occasions are required to serve detention after school on the same day, during which, they will engage in self-study or reading. All students required to serve detention must do so on the actual date of offence regardless of involvement in competitions, tuition classes, remedial sessions and CCAs. Recalcitrant offenders who do not respond positively to the school's intervention measures may face other disciplinary actions such as in-school/home suspension or caning.

6.2 School Dismissal

All students will be dismissed at 2.40pm on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays. On Wednesdays, students will be dismissed at 1.30pm and on Fridays at 12.30pm. School dismissal time for the Secondary 1 Students will be adjusted during the first week of school due to Secondary 1 Orientation Activities. Parents can refer to the Information on Secondary 1 Orientation Activities, including dismissal timing sent out via PG previously.

6.3 MOE Safe Management Measures (SMM)

In line with the easing of community SMMs, SMMs for schools are guided by the broad parameters presented below:

(A) Mask Wearing

Mask-wearing has been made optional except on public transport and in health care facilities e.g. clinics and hospitals. Mask wearing will be optional in the school premises. Please continue to remind your child to pack a mask in his/her schoolbag in the event that he/she is required to put it on outside of school.

(B) Being Socially Responsible

While MOH has stopped issuing health risk notices (HRN) to close contacts of Covid-19 positive cases. Parents are to alert the Character Coaches if their child in HS has tested positive for Covid-19.

(C) Wipe-Down Routine

Students will continue their personal hygiene habits and wipe-down routine of tables and shared equipment after use.

All the above SMMs will continue until otherwise advised, pending the national posture in response to the COVID-19 situation. For updates on the COVID-19 situation, you can visit moh.gov.sg or sign up at go.gov.sg/whatsapp to receive the latest information via WhatsApp.

6.4 Usage of Mobile Phone and Electronic Devices

In order for effective teaching and learning to take place, we need to set boundaries for our students. Mobile phones/electronic devices may be used only during these timings:

- Before 7.30 am
- During recess time (restricted to the canteen and the foyer area only)
- After the last period of the formal curriculum time

We would like to emphasize that our students are to switch off their mobile phones and any other electronic devices during curriculum time. The mobile phones are to be kept in the bags. Mobile phones/electronic devices should also be kept out of sight and switched off/kept on silent mode during the change-over of lessons and while students are walking along the corridor.

If the mobile device policy is violated, the mobile phone/electronic device will be confiscated and kept under lock and key in the General Office. **Confiscated handphones/electronic devices will be returned only after 5 school days.**

6.5 iPads

iPads may be used during curriculum time for teaching and learning purposes. During classroom lessons where iPads are not required for learning, they should be put away and not accessed. Students should follow teacher's instructions on "screens up" and "screens down". If iPads are used inappropriately during curriculum time, disciplinary actions will be meted out accordingly.

6.6 <u>Maintaining good behaviour at all times</u>

The school places great emphasis on inculcating good habits in our students, such as the prudent use of time. As such, we would like to emphasise that students are not to loiter and misbehave in the neighbourhood after school. We urge you to strongly advise your child/ward to behave appropriately at all times especially while he/she is in school uniform.

6.7 Attire and Grooming

The school's grooming and attire policy is aimed at educating Hougeans to look smart and presentable at all times. Having proper attire and grooming is an outward expression of students' readiness to learn. It is also important as it signifies the pride that students have for themselves and the school. To achieve the above intent, grooming and attire checks are carried out periodically throughout the year.

If the students' grooming and attire is not appropriate, a grace period of 2 days will be given for rectification with a follow-up check. Students who fail the follow-up check will be sent home to have the grooming issue/s rectified and parents will be informed.

6.8 Revised Uniform Guidelines

To provide greater degree of comfort and flexibility to students, the school has revised uniform guidelines which will take effect from Term 1 Week 2. Please refer to the e-GRIT Journal and school website for more details.

6.9 CCA T-shirt

Secondary 1 to 5 students are encouraged to wear their approved CCA T-shirts on Tuesdays with school pants/skorts if they have no PE lessons. Students who have PE on that day will continue to report to school in their PE attire and then change into their CCA T-shirts during snack break, recess or after 2.40 pm. Students who do not wish to wear their CCA T-shirts are expected to be in school attire according to their respective class timetables.

Students are to wear full School uniform/School Polo-Ts on days with internal and national examinations.

6.10 <u>Snack</u> Break

There will be a 10-minute snack break on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday between 9.00-9.10 am to enhance students' well-being. Students may bring light and healthy snacks from home to consume in class during the break. Some examples of such snacks are sandwiches, muffins, fruits such as apples and bananas and energy bars. As a whole-school effort, the students will take ownership in ensuring good hygiene practices to keep their classrooms clean and conducive for learning.

7. Communication with Teachers

7.1 In line with the Ministry of Education's Five-Day Work Week, parents are encouraged to respect teachers' personal time and space. Teachers can be contacted during weekdays between 7.30 am and 6 pm. They are not expected to respond to parents'/ students' queries during weekends or after 6pm on weekdays except for emergencies. We seek your understanding and support on this.

8. Using Students' Images/Recordings for Publications
